2013 HIGHLIGHTS

- Under the partnership with the RM of North Cypress, the WWCD planted 7 km of new shelterbelts in 2013. Landowners received a reimbursement of \$500 per mile planted.
- On March 13, the largest Conservation Agreement in Manitoba was signed on the Lakeview Community Pasture. This agreement will protect approximately 17,400 acres of land in the RM of Lakeview around the Big Grass Marsh. The CA was initiated by the RM of Lakeview Council, and made possible under WWCD's partnership with the Manitoba Habitat Heritage Corporation.
- Robert Rodgers, who is currently chairman of the WWCD, was honored with this year's Conservation District Builders Award for long-standing and dedicated service to conservation in Manitoba. Robert has been the chairperson of the WWCD for the last 15 years, was chairman of the MCDA for 3 years, and continues to farm with his family near Westbourne.
- The District welcomes Jodie Byram as our new Administrator; and thanks Ward Rempel and Theresa Francis for their years of service, and wishes them the best of luck in their future endeavors.
- Birds and other wildlife take refuge in long grasses, and can easily be killed by tractors and haying equipment. Over \$1-million was spent comprised of approximately \$669,600 from the Department of Conservation & Water Stewardship, \$300,178 from local levies and landowners, and \$138,183 external dollars from Lake Winnipeg Basin Stewardship Fund, Growing Assurance Ecological Goods & Services, Green Team, and EMO.

The 8 sub-districts in the WWCD are managed by local people representing various councils included in that sub-district. This allows for decisions to be made based on effects both up and downstream. Local sub-districts set works such as drain cleanouts and crossing replacements within their area and set appropriate budgets. The Chairs of the sub-districts form the Main Board which is responsible for policy and programs as a whole.

The WWCD was formed in 1972 to address the many issues and concerns within the 1.8 million acre Whitemud River Watershed Basin. The District is responsible for 1750 km of provincial waterways and for 1189 provincial crossings.

CONSERVATION AWARD

The RM of North Cypress was the WWCD recipient of the Conservation Award at the 2013 Manitoba Conservation District Association conference.

In 1989, North Cypress partnered with the WWCD to establish and maintain 121 miles of Conservation Corridors that protect undeveloped public road allowances. These serve as a home for many plants, birds, and other wildlife.

In 2011, the RM partnered with Agriculture & Agri-Food Canada and the WWCD to establish two "Eco-Buffer" demonstration sites. The eco-buffers are designed to be self-sustaining, provide food and habitat for wildlife, as well as being an effective windbreak.

The RM also recognizes the value of shelterbelts and the need to incorporate windbreaks with large-scale agriculture. In 2013, the Shelterbelt Incentive Program was launched providing a \$500 reimbursement to landowners for the establishment of field shelterbelts.

The RM has partnered with the WWCD to construct two water retention projects that when completed will hold approximately 150 to 200 acre-feet of water.
